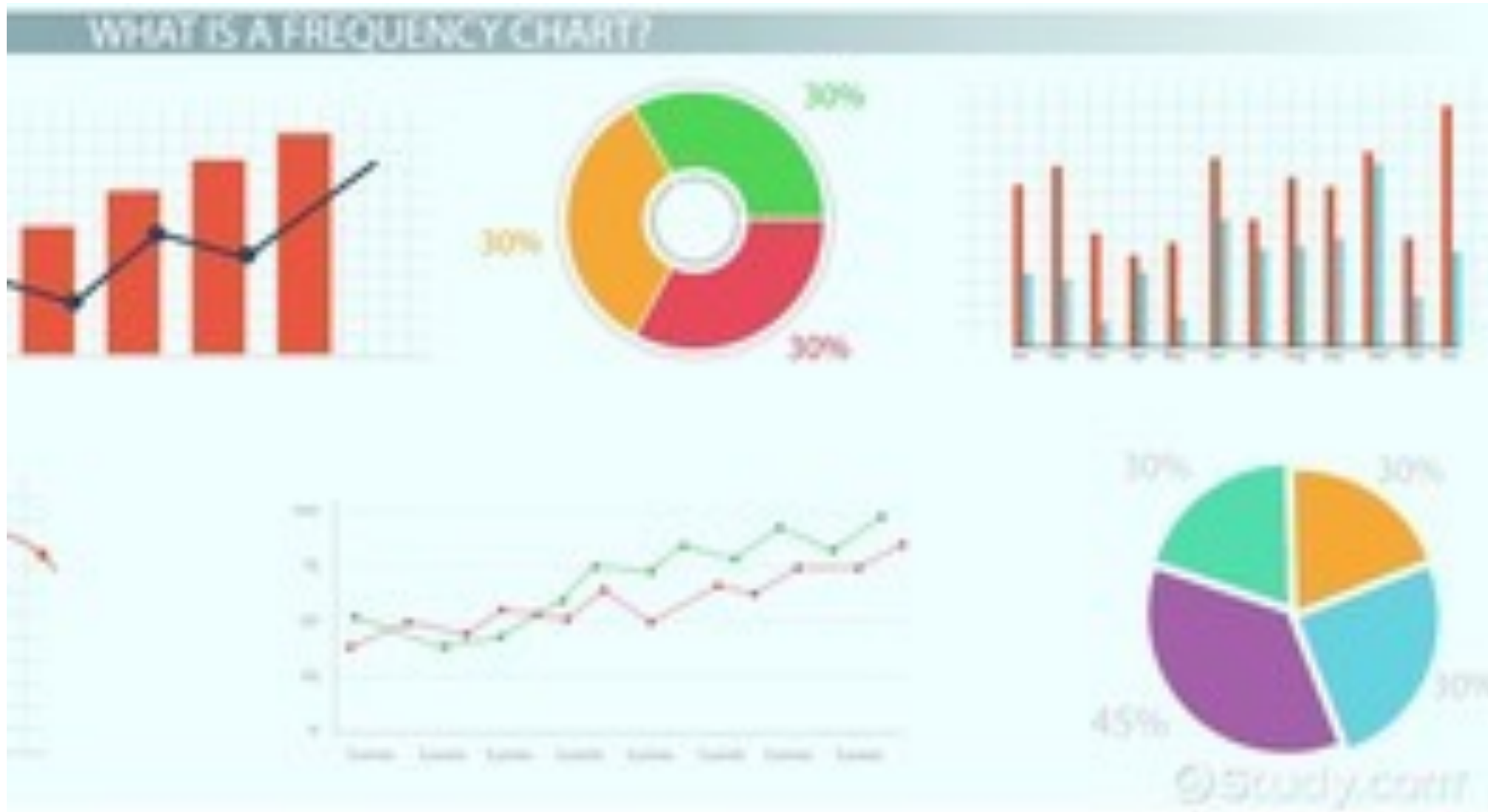

All Ears

Listening willingly, waiting for an explanation



Lend an Ear

Listen



Give Someone an Earful

Angrily express an opinion to someone



Play It by Ear

To respond to circumstances instead of having a fixed plan



I'm All Ears

You have my attention, so you should talk



The Walls Have Ears

We may be overheard; be careful what you say



That's Music to My Ears

I am very happy to hear this.



Wet Behind the Ears

Inexperienced, immature, new to something

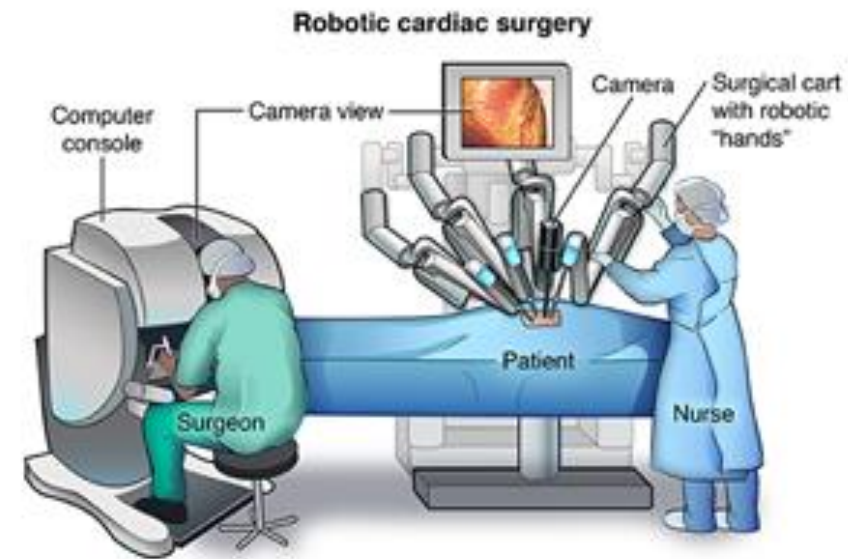


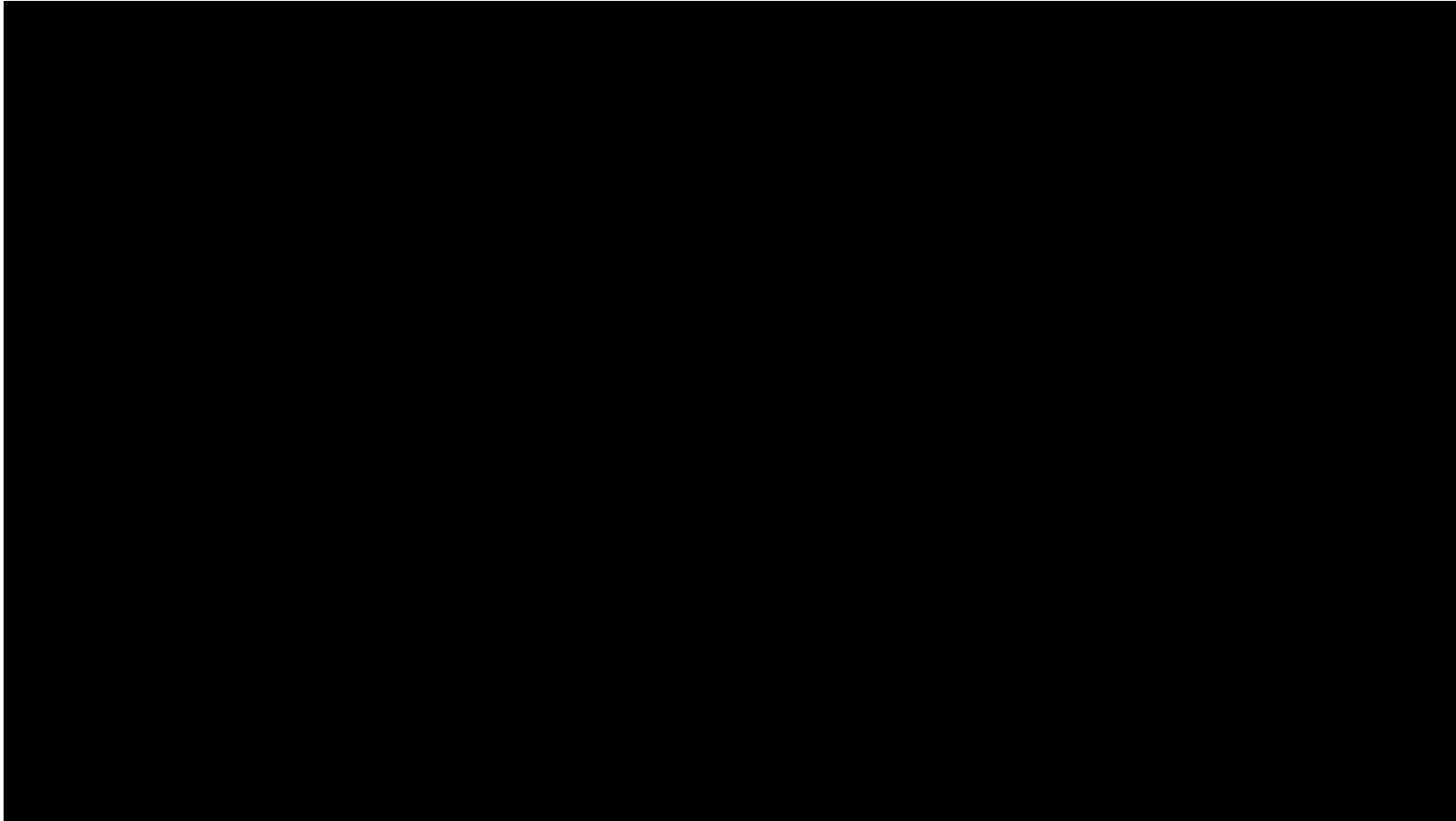
Figure 2 Robotic cardiac surgery. Credits: www.hopkinsmedicine.org
